HOW IT WORKS

Start a New Fund

- If you start a new permanent fund (such as one supporting a specific cause or organization), your donation will be matched up to \$2,000.
- To qualify, you need to commit to growing the fund to at least \$10,000 within three years.

Important Details

- Scholarship funds and certain donor-advised funds do not qualify for this program.
- Each fund can only receive a match once during the three-year program period.

ELIGIBLE FUND TYPES

- ▶ **Designated fund**
Benefits a specific cause or organization.
- ▶ **Field of interest fund**
Produces grants for a targeted area of need.
- ▶ **Organizational fund**
Creates a stream of income for an organization.
- ▶ **Donor-advised fund**
A charitable fund that allows the donor to help determine how grants are awarded.

ENDOWED FUNDS EXPLAINED

An endowed fund is a permanent fund where the principal is invested, and only the earnings are used to support charitable causes, ensuring a lasting impact over time. Endowed funds are ideal for donors seeking to create a legacy of perpetual giving.

OCCF funds become endowed once they reach \$10,000. This means also means that the funds have the potential to benefit Osborne County programs and organizations for perpetuity, creating a sustainable foundation for future growth and development.
